qualificar e profissionalizar o fazer pedagógico dos professores e ressignificar as aprendizagens das crianças. Com a mesma intensidade e propósito, nestas páginas discorreremos sobre a importância da formação continuada, que impacta na gestão pedagógica e institucional das escolas de educação infantil e qualificam a educação pública de Maceió. Nessa perspectiva, apresentamos os elementos básicos da formação continuada do coordenador pedagógico e a política pública que sustenta esses

fazerem. Assim, apresentamos à Secretária Municipal de Educação uma proposta formativa legitimada por esse grupo de profissionais.
